


Wonderful World Book Day 2024

HAF – Spring Offer

The Milton Keynes Spring Activities and Food programme will be taking place **Monday 8 April to Thursday 11 April 2024** – providing over 8,200 free activity and food sessions for children, young people and their families who are in receipt of benefit related Free School Meals. The programme will go live on **Monday 19 March** via the <u>online booking system</u> here.

The spring offer will take place in 55 locations across MK, including 11 locations with dedicated support for children with special educational needs and disabilities.


