Phonics Screening Check

The week beginning the 10th of June all children in Year 1 will be participating in the phonics screening check. This is a short statutory assessment which focusses on phonics skills. Each child will be asked to read 40 words. The words will be a mixture of real and pseudo words (words that are not real) to ensure that they are using their decoding skills. You will be informed on how your child did during the screening and there is an opportunity to revisit this again in Year 2 if needed. 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

Guided Reading

Please ensure that the children's <u>red reading</u> record and reading books are sent in with them daily. In Year 1 we complete 3 Guided Reading sessions a week with each session focussing on a particular skill. These are:

- Decoding this is where the children use their phonic knowledge and growing fluency to read the text for the first time.
- Prosody this is where the children begin to read with prosody, so they develop reading with appropriate meaning, stress and intonation. It provides an opportunity to explore characters' feelings, what words mean and how punctuation adds to meaning.
- Comprehension this is where the children demonstrate their understanding of the book and answer questions. They will be able to automatically apply their decoding skills to read with greater accuracy and fluency.

Exploring Our World

- In English this half term, we are basing our learning different settings and stories. The children will become authors and create their own character and setting before writing their very own story. We will be focusing on spelling our tricky words correctly and using the suffixes -er, -est, -ed, -es and -s). The children will continue to focus on writing sentences using capital letters, full stops and finger spaces and extending our sentences using and, and because.
- During History, the children will learn all about the importance of exploring and who are the significant explorers that have impacted impact on our world today. These include: Christopher Columbus, Neil Armstrong, Mary Anning, David Attenborouand Mae Jemison.
- In Maths the children will be learning all about time. They will also look at days of the week, months of the year before learning how to tell the time focusing on half past and o'clock.





- Continuing with our theme in Science we are learning all about plants. The children will plant their own sunflower and be responsible for looking after it until the end of term. They will be identifying a range of wild and garden flowers as well as looking at deciduous and evergreen trees.
- In Art the children will be looking at landscapes and sketching their own landscape of a view that they pick in school. We can't wait to see their final pieces!
- In PSHE our topic is changing me. We will be looking at lifecycles and how we have changed since we were a baby, naming body parts and talking about how to cope with change.
- In RE we are looking at places of worship and why they are important to us. We are hoping to walk to Tattenhoe Church before the end of term.
- In computing the children will continue to consolidate their skills in coding and spreadsheets.

June


