Our year is speeding away so quickly! Your children continue to be a joy to teach, and they show such an eagerness to learn and do well! In **English** this term we will be reading the 'Lost and Found' and book about the friendship between a boy and a penguin, by Oliver Jeffers. We will be using the text and the animation to inspire our writing. We will be writing a descriptive narrative, a letter and a retelling. In addition, we will be researching penguins and will be creating our own non-chronological reports and publishing them for display.

Linking to our them of the seaside, in **Art** we will be learning about the artwork of Cornish artist John Dyer and will be painting in his style and are lucky enough to

have a painting lesson with him as part of our enrichment!

Our **Geography** work will link to this as we compare Milton Keynes to Cornwall in land use and features.

In **RE**, we will continue to learn about the Christian faith. We will learn more about Christian stories such as Noah and The Ark and the Christian story of Creation.

In **computing** we will be using Purple Mash to create spreadsheets. In **music**, we will continue to explore pitch and rhythm with Mrs Horwood in music each week.

In PSHE/Jigsaw lessons, we will be learning about change and how we change as we grow and how we manage change in our lives, for example moving on to Year 3.



We still have a lot of learning left to do this term before the end of year!

You can help your child in the following ways:

- 1. Read with your child for 10 minutes every day and ask a range of questions. Please record your comments in the small red book.
- 2. Make sure that your child can read and spell the common exception words (Year1 and 2).
 - We also have words on Google Classroom home words that are needed to learn. Please check these if you have not already.
- 3. Mymaths homework is set weekly please check all work has been completed and if there are low scores, the children can do the activities as many times as needed. This will build upon work done in class.
 - Topmarks website and play 'Hit the Button'. There is also an app that you can download onto a tablet/iPad. These will help with number fluency and speed.
- 4. Use everyday Maths opportunities to tell the time/ count money/weigh and read scales.

As the weather is warming up, could we please ask that your child continues to brings a named water bottle to school each day. In addition, on very hot days, could you please apply sunscreen to your child before school and it is advisable for them to bring a hat for extra protection.

Stardust, science and stem subjects combine to create a touching picture book that's perfect for bedtime.


