Spring 2025 – Half Term 2

Spring has truly arrived and we hope you are enjoying some slightly warmer weather! We are now in our 4th half term of the year and we have more exciting new topics coming up. This is the half term known for the Priory Rise sing off and I know we are going to have a great time preparing for this.

Year 4 Curriculum

In **English,** we are using a brilliant story called 'There's a Rang-Tan in my bedroom' which highlights the issues surrounding deforestation and links well with our Geography topic. We will be using this exciting text to compose our own work in different genres including: a narrative, a persuasive letter and a nonchronological report.

In **Maths**, we will begin our fractions unit. We will compare, order and convert fractions as well as find the equivalents. After this, we will focus on adding and subtracting fractions and will explore how they correspond with decimals.

In Science, our focus will be on Teeth and Digestion! The children will explore how the digestive system works by looking at the different parts and their functions. We will examine the different types of teeth and their jobs. This unit will conclude with a scientific investigation.


In **Art** this half term, we are learning about a famous architect from Barcelona named Antoni Gaudi. We will explore the features of his architectural art and look at his work in depth before creating our own artwork inspired by his trencadis technique.

In **Music**, children will continue their learning journey with Mrs Horwood on the keyboard. They will build on their skills from last half term and will continue to develop their hand position and reading musical notation.

In **Computing** this half term, we will be writing for different audiences. The children will explore text formatting to make a piece of writing fit for its audience and purpose. Additionally, they will interpret incoming communications and use simulated scenarios to develop their understanding of writing using software.

In **RE** this half term, we will continue our learning about Judaism. We will explore different Jewish events such as Shabbat, Hannukah and Passover. We will dive into how these are celebrated and the features of each.

In **Geography**, our topic is Rainforests. We are going to explore rainforests around the world, discovering where they are located and what their climate is like. We will discuss the layers of the rainforest and compare different types of forests identifying their geographical features.



Homework

Homework will be set weekly.

It will be set on a Friday afternoon and should be returned the following Friday. This will be set on MyMaths and on Google Classroom.

Alongside this, it is the expectation that children will practice their times tables each week using TTRS or Purple Mash.

At Priory Rise we consider homework to be extremely important as a means of continuing and developing the learning that takes place in the classroom. We welcome the support that parents provide in assisting their children with homework at home and encouraging the children to complete their tasks to the best of their ability and to the highest of standards.



Times Table Check

Later in the year, the children will carry out a national assessment on their times tables knowledge. We want to prepare them as much as possible for this.

To support them in their progress, we have set a weekly assessment in Purple Mash for them to complete. This mirrors the actual platform of the check and is great practice to build their confidence, speed and accuracy

Reading!

To encourage children to read regularly at home, we will continue using 'punch cards' at school. These are small cards that are 'punched' once when the children have read at least three times each week. These will be stamped on a Friday.

After 10 stamps, the children will receive a special treat to reward their amazing reading at home.

It would be great if you could ensure you read with your child as much as you can at home. By doing this it will **significantly** help their reading progress within school. Thank you! ⁽²⁾

All children will have the opportunity to visit the library once a week.


During their time in the library, the children have access to a wide range of texts.

Children who are 'free readers' are allowed to select 2 library books as these replace their banded reading book.




Book recommendations for year 4
