Welcome to the second half of the Autumn term! Time has flown by already and the children have really settled into Year 4 life. As always, we have a vast array of amazing topics and exciting enrichment opportunities coming up which we are all very excited about.

Year 4 Curriculum

In **English,** we will begin the half term by creating a non-chronological report on the Victorians. After this, we will be moving on to writing a balanced argument. The children will apply their Victorians knowledge to all of our English work.

In Maths, we will explore area before moving on to our multiplication and division unit of work.

We will continue to build on our maths skills with increasing levels of challenge.

In **Science**, our focus will be on Electricity! The children will explore and make electrical circuits focusing on how it works effectively. They will look at each component and identify conductors and insulators.

In our **Art** lessons, we will be producing some art in the style of William Morris using his nature inspired art for our own inspiration. We will learn about the techniques and use of symmetry in this style of art and use them in our own paintings.

In **Music**, children will continue their learning journey with Mrs Horwood on the keyboard. They will build on their skills from last half term.

In **Computing** this half term, children will start a brand-new topic called microbit which uses coding skills to program a component. It is very interactive and I know it will be a great addition to our computing curriculum.


In **RE** this half term, we will be learning about Christianity and Christmas. We will discuss pilgrimages and explore special journeys in the Christmas story.

In **History**, we will develop our knowledge and understanding of life in Victorian Britain. We are going to immerse ourself in Victoria life looking into the who they were, what life was like and explore the significance of the industrial revolution.

In **PSHE**, we will follow the unit entitled 'celebrating differences. We will discuss acceptance of ourselves and others as well as recognizing the impact of making assumptions. We will encourage the children to question the influences of making assumptions and how to react and respond to bullying.

Reading!

To encourage children to continue reading at home, we will be using 'punch cards' at school. These are small cards that are 'punched' once when the children have read at least three times each week. These will be stamped on a Friday.

After 10 stamps, the children will receive a special treat to reward their amazing reading at home.

It would be great if you could ensure you read with your child as much as you can at home. By doing this it will **significantly** help their reading progress within school. Thank you! ©

I for Inference

Inference skills are tricky to master and require children to search for clues in the text that are not always obvious. It requires lots of practice and support.

Here are some questions you could ask your child when reading together at home:

- Who is telling the story?
- What was thinking when?
- Why did decide to do that?
- What kind of character do you think is? Why?
- Why did the author choose to use this (word/technique)?




