## Curriculum Overview

### Rowling, Blackman, Balen



This half term in **English**, all our writing will be based around the book *Holes* by Louis Sachar. Over the course of the half term, the children will write: a character description, a short narrative by continuing the story in their own way through their predicting skills and finally a balanced argument.

We will be focusing on fractions in **Maths** this term. This will include equivalent fractions, converting fractions, comparing and ordering fractions, adding and subtracting fractions, which includes mixed numbers.

Our **Science** topic this term is 'Living Things and Their Habitats'. Throughout this topic, we will be exploring life processes of reproductive plants, plant reproduction and life cycles of mammals, amphibians, insects and birds. Finally, we will make comparisons between two life cycles.

We will be having our first **French** lessons of Year 5. During our lessons, we will be learning how to say what the weather is like, the date and our birthdays using our Year 4 knowledge of months of the year.

In **Art** this term, we will be studying the famous artist, Matisse. We will examine his art work before creating our own group painting of Matisse. After doing this, we will be creating our own collage to replicate his artwork and will share our ideas by doing a gallery walk of our work.

In **PSHE**, children will be following the Jigsaw unit 'Celebrating Differences'. In this unit, children will understand different cultures, racism, the different types of bullying and how we can all celebrate differences.



In **Geography** this half term, we will be learning about Mountains. We will learn what mountains are, how they are formed, locate different mountain ranges and finally make comparisons between a mountain range in the UK and elsewhere.

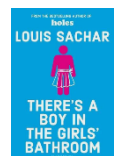
## Our reading recommendations

### Miss Raval recommends:

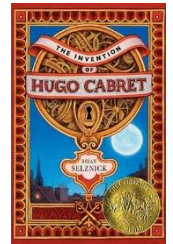
Luna and her Dad are living on the moon as her Dad is part of a team, which are mining it for precious rocks and minerals. Suddenly, a meteor crashes into it and Luna is devastatingly separated from her father. Stranded on the moon, totally alone, with only a limited supply of oxygen, how will Luna get back? I love this book as it is a fantastic adventure book that builds tension making you want to read on whilst feeding you with scientific information about living on the moon and what it is like to be in space. Fiction and non-fiction combined into one-what's better!



Miss Cook recommends: There's a boy in the girl's bathroom by Louis Sachar. This book is a wonderful story that follows a boy who feels disconnected with those around him, always being seen as the 'naughty' child. He has no friends and no one who believes him. This all changes when he meets a new friend and a new teacher in school who **appreciates** him for who he is.

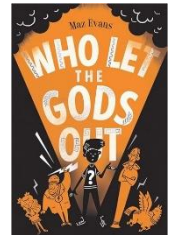


**Mrs Dobson recommends:** The Invention of Hugo Cabaret by Brian Selznick is a beautiful text that shares a wonderful story set in Paris, France of a clock keeper and a thief's story. A mechanical man with a secret is also at the heart of the story. The book captures your attention as it has over 284 pages of pictures alone! But this is certainly not a picture book. Each illustration tells part of the story and really helps to grow your inference skills. Worth a read!



**Mrs Huish recommends:** Who Let the Gods Out by Maz Evans

Who Let the Gods Out is an exciting and funny book from a series of books by Maz Evans. This particular book is about a young boy called Elliot. His mum suffers from dementia, he wants to look after her. He meets a goddess called Virgo. Together they accidentally release the god of death and need to turn to the Greek Gods for help.
